Dear Senator:

On behalf of the higher education associations listed below, I write to express support for S. 1762, the Higher Education Access Act of 2007. Senators Kennedy and Enzi deserve enormous credit for their efforts to make college more affordable for the millions of American students who have worked hard to prepare for college, but whose families lack the resources to send them.

S. 1762 will provide an unprecedented \$17 billion boost in federal assistance for needy students by reducing subsidies in the federal student loan program. This increase in mandatory funding, combined with the discretionary funds allocated to the Pell Grant program in the FY 2008 Labor, Health and Human Services and Education appropriation bill, would make possible the largest Pell Grant maximum in history. We deeply appreciate this bold step toward expanding the federal government's commitment to educational opportunity for all who are qualified to pursue a college education. We also trust that it will result in a significant expansion of funding for the Pell Grant program that will be delivered in the most efficient way to the neediest of Pell Grant recipients.

We support the passage of S. 1762, and urge all members of the Senate to vote in favor of increased access to college for low- and middle-income students.
