New Routes to Campus Internationalization

Recent ACE research reveals that there are major gaps and slow progress towards campus internationalization. All too frequently internationalization efforts at U.S. institutions of higher education have been focused on a few disparate sets of activities – like modern language education, education abroad, recruitment of international students, area and international studies, or faculty research collaborations. If students or faculty are not directly involved in one of these activities, they may find institutional internationalization efforts irrelevant. With the increasing reference to student global competency in institutional vision and mission statements, institutional leaders are now working to broaden stakeholder's understanding and commitment to internationalization.

The 2008 Leadership Network meeting will focus on how institutional leaders develop new ways to engage a broad coalition of campus constituents in a multi-faceted approach to internationalization – defined as the process for infusing international, intercultural or global dimension into the teaching, research and service functions of the institution
