


ACE FELLOWS PROGRAM

1965-66 to 2015-16


The Fellows Program has prepared almost 1,900 aspiring leaders over the past 50 years. Fellows are nominated for the Program by college presidents at their home institutions, spend up to a year mentored by senior leaders at host institutions, and meet with a cohort of Fellows periodically throughout their fellowship. This intensive Program develops knowledge and skills for leaders committed to shaping the effectiveness and future direction of higher education. Findings from a 2014–15 comprehensive review indicate that this success is driven, in part, through diverse and talented participants—across racial/ethnic groups, gender, and sector—who facilitate breadth of opportunity and perspective.
