U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative Background

Conceptualized by the American Council on Education in 2017 and supported through a grant from the U.S. Embassy Tokyo, Japan, In coordination with Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (MEXT)

A two-year pilot initiative to strengthen U.S.-Japan higher education relations through a new mode of collaboration called collaborative online international learning (COIL)

Supports a limited number but diverse selection of U.S. higher education institutions to collaborate with new or existing Japanese institutional partners on developing COIL courses








U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative CIGE Model for Comprehensive Internationalization

U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative What is global learning?



"Global learning is the process of diverse people collaboratively analyzing and addressing complex problems that transcend borders.

Global learning strategies enable groups to determine relationships among diverse perspectives on problems and to develop equitable, sustainable solutions for the world's interconnected human and natural communities."








U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative Global Learning Outcomes

- •64% of U.S. institutions have specified international or global student learning outcomes for all students, or for students in some schools, departments, or programs.
- •9% increase since 2011.
- **More** institutions have established global learning outcomes and implemented academic policies (e.g., general education requirements) to extend the reach of internationally focused content to a larger proportion of students.











U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative What is Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL)?

COIL is also known as globally networked learning, virtual mobility, tele-collaboration

The term "collaborative online international learning" combines the four essential dimensions of real virtual mobility: It is a collaborative exercise of teachers and students; it makes use of online technology and interaction; it has potential international dimensions; and it is integrated into the learning process. (de Wit 2013)

COIL is not:

- · A replacement for study abroad
- A massive open online course (MOOC) or online course
- A curriculum
- Teleconferencing
- A technology platform
- Software

COIL is:

- Team teaching across two or more cultures using online communication
- Structured so that the success of students in each class depends upon the others'
- Customized, to fit the mission, culture, and learning outcomes of each institution
- Applicable to any discipline

U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative Purpose and Objectives

To demonstrate the effectiveness of COIL as a new course method for promoting student global learning

To encourage student access to global learning and exchange opportunities

To expand U.S.-Japan higher education partnerships through COIL











U.S.-Japan COIL Initiative Eligibility

- U.S. accredited, degree-granting institutions, including two- and four-year colleges, private and public universities, and nonprofit and for-profit entities are eligible.
- Institutions either with or without existing partnerships with Japanese institutions are eligible.
- Proposals must link at least one creditbearing course at a U.S. institution with one at a Japanese institution
- □COIL must at least be a component of the course for a **minimum of three weeks** and be offered in the **Spring** or **Fall 2019** semesters.

- ☐ Institutions with existing partnerships must develop two COIL courses
- Applicants must identify a three-member campus team: an instructional faculty member, international programs administrator, and instructional design specialist.



Institutions with existing COIL courses with a Japanese institution are **ineligible** to apply.

At least one letter from a senior administrator is required


