San Diego



- The military contributes more than \$13 billion+ annually to the regional economy

Veterans at San Diego State



- The dropout rate for first-time freshmen veterans on campus is 7.5 points less than that of our overall student body
- Their cumulative GPA is .21 points higher

Fall 2009 Admission

- **November 2008**
Last month to take the SAT/ACT (freshman applicants)

Submit supplemental transfer application (located in students' SDSU WebPortal transfer applicants)
- **November 1, 2008**

- **January 1 – March 2, 2009**

- **Early February, 2009**
Deadline to apply for SDSU scholarships at www.sdsu.edu/scholarships

Veterans, Active Duty Military and Dependents

Thank you for your interest in San Diego State University! This information sheet provides details about SDSU's admissions process. You are strongly encouraged to review admission criteria and to contact the Office of Admissions for assistance well in advance of the application deadline. San Diego State values its veterans, active duty military and dependent students. We will do everything in our means to assist you as you embark on an exciting academic career with us.

Freshmen Eligibility

All first-time freshmen applicants must complete the pattern of college preparatory curriculum (see www.sdsu.edu/admissions). A first-time freshman is defined as a student who has earned no college credit after the summer immediately following high school graduation. More than 13% of SDSU's undergraduates are age 25 or older.

Admission for SDSU Out-of-Service Area*

• You will be admitted if you meet SDSU's competitive eligibility index criteria for applicants outside of SDSU's service area. For fall 2008, the average eligibility index of admitted freshmen who met the selective criteria was 4,182.0009 (based on ACT). The average high school grade point average was 3.61. The average SAT Reasoning Test total score was 1,345; the average ACT composite score was 25. The eligibility index for fall 2009 may be higher.

Admission for SDSU Service Area*

• Applicants in SDSU's service area who have the minimum CSU eligibility index of 2900 will be admitted. Fall admission is based on self-reported information. Your admission may be rescinded if your GPA, test scores or course grades are lower than what is reported on the application. Please make sure to report accurate information.

Transfer Eligibility

All transfer applicants must meet the following requirements to be considered for admission:

- Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units by the end of spring 2009.
- Complete General Education (GE) requirements in written communication, oral communication, critical thinking, and mathematics with a "C" or higher in each course by the end of spring 2009.
- Meet the Grade Point Average (GPA) required for the major to which you apply (see www.sdsu.edu/majors/gpa). Applicants must meet the required GPA at the time of application, and must maintain the GPA through the end of spring 2009.

Applicants who meet the criteria listed above will be ranked based on the completion of lower division General Education course work and preparation for the major. Out-of-service area applicants will be selected based on a GPA ranking that may be higher than the major GPA.

* SDSU's service area includes credit from institutions in San Diego County that are located south of State Route 56 and extending eastward AND Imperial Valley County.

SDSU Veterans Affairs Office

Students who are eligible for veterans, dependent, or reservist VA, education benefits should visit SDSU's Veterans Affairs Office. The Veterans Affairs Office can offer assistance with applying for education benefits, coordinating the VA, work study program, and processing tutorial assistance paperwork.

Students planning to attend SDSU should contact the Veterans Affairs Office two months before the beginning of their first semester to learn how to file for benefits. Students that miss the application deadline due to circumstances beyond their control (i.e. serving in the military active duty) should contact the Veterans Affairs Office or Office of Admissions for information regarding petition appeal procedures.

Services Offered by the Veterans Affairs Office

SDSU offers the following educational benefits to veterans and dependents:

- Chapter 30 (Montgomery GI Bill - Active Duty)
- Chapter 30 (Montgomery GI Bill - Currently Serving on Active Duty)
- Chapter 1606 (Montgomery GI Bill - Reservist)
- Chapter 1607 (Reserve Educational Assistance Program)
- Chapter 31 (Vocational Rehabilitation)
- Chapter 35 (Dependents Educational Assistance)
- California Veterans Fee Waiver Program (Dependents of Veterans with a Service-Connected Disability)

Please note that in order for a student to use their benefits while attending SDSU, the student must be a regularly matriculated student and all classes taken must be required for the educational objective selected.

Cost of Attendance

All students, regardless of residency status, pay registration fees. Non-residents of California pay tuition of \$339 per unit in addition to these fees. The following example shows the estimated 9-month costs for a student from California living in university housing and taking 15 units per semester in 2009/10.

Books and supplies	1,546
On-campus housing and food	11,266
Transportation	1,242
Miscellaneous costs	2,540

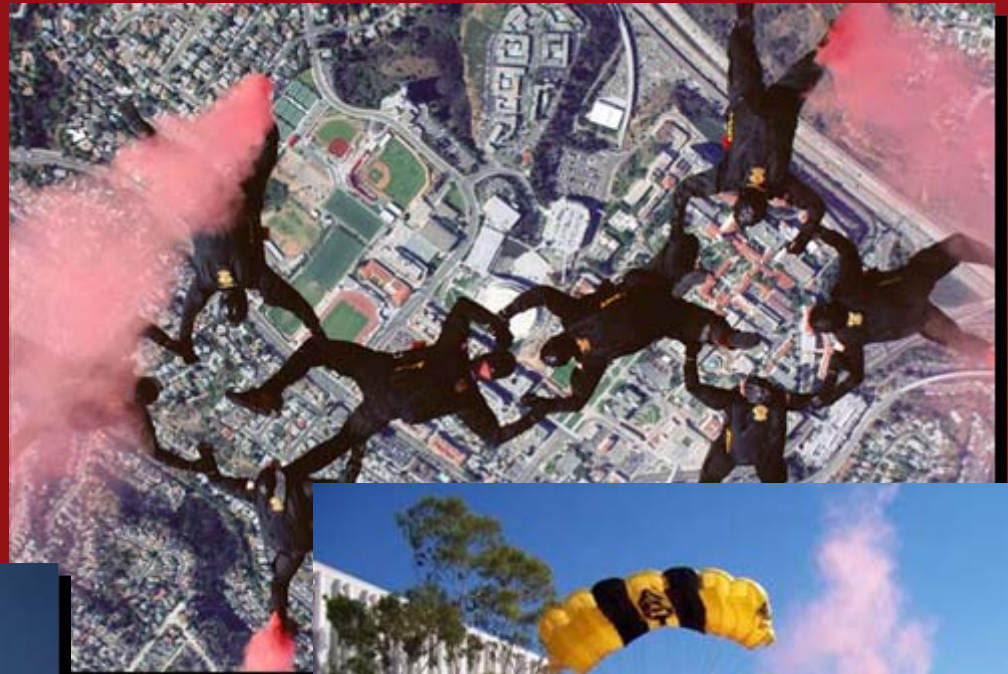
