1. Header

The header section will feature standard information including the Accredible logo, official transcript title, transcript issued date and transcript identifier.

2. Issued For

This section includes unique student identification information used to verify identity and match to existing student records. The section includes the learner's name, email address, and name of person or organization to which the transcript was issued.

3. Credential Summary

The credential summary section includes a list of the learner's completed courses or experiences. Use this section to assess program alignment with your institution's offerings. Evaluation for transfer credit is recommended based on your institution's transfer credit policies.

4. ACE Credit Recommendations

The ACE Transcript is an official transcript that contains credentials evaluated by the American Council on Education (ACE). ACE's recommendations are intended to guide institutional decisions about the award of credit for prior learning.

ACE Learning Evaluations reviews are conducted by experienced college and university faculty who assess the content, scope, and rigor of an organization's educational program and make appropriate recommendations for comparable college credit and competencies achieved by learners. DEFINITIONS

Issued On: The date when the learner completed the associated credential.

Issued For: The learner's legal name as entered by the learner at the time of transcript request.

American Council on Education Endorsement:

Credentials that carry an ACE endorsement of recommended college credits or validated competencies published on the ACE National Guide.

ACE ID: ACE-endorsed credentials include a unique identifier that ACE assigns to courses and examinations (e.g., ACE-0001 v1). The letter prefix designates the organization providing the experience. Version number is based on the date that the credential was earned. The ACE ID is hyperlinked to the ACE National Guide exhibit for the credential.

Competencies: These competency statements are from recognized, industry-approved frameworks, and have been validated by the faculty team as outcomes demonstrated

by learners who successfully complete the evaluated learning experience. They represent workplace-relevant skills, knowledge, and abilities expected of professionals in corresponding industries.

Credit Recommendations: Credit recommendations for college credit are designated in semester hour units (SH). Levels at which recommendations are issued include vocational/certificate, lower division (100- to 200-level courses), upper division (300- to 400-level courses), and graduate (500-level courses and above).

Overall Minimum Passing Percentage: The minimum score the credential provider sets for learners to receive the credential. ACE-endorsed credentials are only included on this official transcript if the student achieved a passing grade. ACE-endorsed courses and exams meet minimum grading requirements—students must earn a minimum grade of C for vocational/certificate, lower division, and upper division credit and a minimum grade of B for graduate-level credit. The credential provider might also supply the learner's actual grade under Credential Details.
