

Number of Institutions, by Sector




## Race and Ethnicity at Rural Institutions Unsurprisingly, the student body at rural institutions is less


RACE AND ETHNICITY OF UNDERGRADUATES AT RURAL INSTITUTIONS AND AT ALL




American Indian or Alaska Native undergraduates in the U.S. attend rural institutions








RATE OF PELL AWARDED, BY SECTOR
