




COURSES & GRADES

ADVISOR ROLE




Beginning with the 2017-2018 application, students can invite individuals assisting them with the application process to view the status of their Common App process.


These advisors are distinct from school counselors.

The Federal Government


From federal grants, to federal student loans, to employment through the federal work-study program, the U.S. Department of Education awards about \$150 billion a year to more than 13 million students and is the largest source of financial aid for students. Start by visiting the Department of Education's Office of Federal Student Aid to learn about the different types of financial aid available to you.

To apply for federal aid, you must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), a form the government uses to give money for college to students who need it. The online form is available starting October 1, 2016! Complete it as early as you can to ensure full eligibility.
